








































- Decreasing security
- Decreasing maintenance
- Less foot fall
- Increased security expenses
- Collapse of public institutions of quality – art galleries, museums, libraries
- Visitors and tourists disappear
- Increasingly expensive to fix

Retreat to the private realm


- Gated residential estates
- Enclosed shopping centres
- Synergies are lost
- Emergence of development islands
- Can survive but not ideal
- Eventual collapse of these rearguards
- Capital flight











- Area wide security
- Rapid response
- Growth in civic pride leads to zero tolerance culture
- Safe for all to walk around 24/7, especially women and children and the elderly
- Horizons widen easier see new opportunities
- Big increase in cultural attractions

Site Visit 2023



Nyanga: Sithandathu Ave - sidewalk not repaired and made good after underground trenching works



CCT maintenance vehicle followed by security detail: Khayelitsha, Monwabisi Park



Nyanga: Ameva St - chemical toilet serving informal settlement residents surrounded by floodwater, rubble and litter



Nolungile: Matonda St - that has no streetlights. There are a number of minor streets in the area without streetlights

Site Visit 2024 (windscreen follow up)



Nyanga: cnr Great Dutch/Sithandathu Ave - sidewalk still not repaired and made good after underground trenching works



Nolungile: Piles of solid waste, leaking water, sewer and stormwater, blocked catch pits



Nolungile: Japhta Masemola Rd. Solid waste significantly improved but still rubble and litter – leaking water and sewer mains



Nolungile: Piles of solid waste, leaking water, sewer and Near Nolungile PTI Precinct – leaking sewer main

- Corruption, lack of skills...
- Crime fighting is a national competency
- No culture of zero tolerance rather of making allowances, "understanding the complexities"
- Extremely rights based legal system
- Weak criminal justice system allows criminals to operate with impunity
- Pricey civil service above inflation salary increases since 1994 increasingly too expensive to do most maintenance tasks
- Extremely complex tendering system 18 -> 24 months to award tenders
